Minutes for Meeting September 26, 2023

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Alexandria met for the regular monthly meeting on September 26, 2023 at 7:00 P.M. The meeting was held in the conference room at the Alexandria Town Hall – DeKalb County, Tennessee.

The council members in attendance were: Lynne Dickerson, Curtis Rutter, and Donnie Bearden Quorum established. Mayor Russell Bradshaw was also present. The meeting commenced with a prayer led by Alderman Donnie Bearden and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Bradshaw requested that the minutes from August 22, 2023 meeting be reviewed. Alderman Curtis Rutter made a motion to accept the minutes for August 22, 2023 as presented. Motion seconded by Alderman Lynne Dickerson. Motion passed unopposed.

Mayor Bradshaw noted there was no Resident Input.

Mayor Bradshaw noted there was no Hearing Requests.

DEPARTMENT MONTHLY REPORTS

Police Report was presented by Chief Bryant; see attachment A.

Water/Sewer Report was presented by Mr. Rich Potter. Mr. Potter stated water system is running well, electric was repaired to support the A/C. Basin aeration and new vales are in and are reprogramed to run. Limit switch on the air adjustment is leaking. Sewer lab and blower room has been cleared out. Shed roof was installed over the UV. High Street lift station pump has been pulled and is being serviced as warranty work. Mr. Potter is working with Industrial Machine concerning the water line and sewer line issues. He also located a truck set of the sewer line 'as built' from the 1970's. He has located additional sewer covers using the 'as built'.

Financial Report; see attachment D. Mrs. Elizabeth Tetlow, CMFO presented the Comptroller's letter of compliance and the TDEC letter releasing the Town from Director's Order DWS21-0030.

Engineer Report was presented by Mr. Jerry Warren. ARP TDEC grant is proceeding. The Town requested Statements of Interest and Qualifications from Engineering Firms (SOQ) and was published with a deadline for submittal of September 26, 2023 of 4:30pm CDT. Town received one (1) SOQ. It was from Warren and Tuggle Civil Engineering. Mr. Warren presented the SOQ to the Board. Alderman Rutter made a motion to contract the services of Warren and Tuggle Civil Engineering for providing services for an allocation of funds provided by the American Rescue Plan, including water and wastewater projects funded by TDEC-ARP. Alderman Dickerson seconded the motion. Motion passed unopposed.

Mr. Warren discussed the TDOT project and has the record drawings for water and sewer which he will email to the Town. TDOT will soon be working on the intersection of Hwy 53 and 70. He has asked a contractor to look at the possibility and cost of a ramp for the Senior Center. Due to some resident complaints concerning the building projects and water runoff/erosion control on E. Main, he spoke to Cody Joe Haynes of Cody Joe Construction concerning adding some additional grading and landscaping. Wilson County line is waiting on the new pumps that have been ordered.

Attorney Report; not present.

Mayor Report was presented by Mayor Bradshaw; Zoning and Code issues on the Town Square are being addressed by the Chief of Police Bryant and Fire Chief Partridge.
